Current By-Laws:

ARTICLE 1

Section 1. (Reg. 22)

The stated meetings of this Lodge shall be held on the first Thursday of each month, except July and August, opening at 7:30 p.m.; unless the meeting shall fall on a national or religious holiday, in such case the meeting shall be held on the following Thursday at 7:30 p.m. Should the meeting be postponed due to weather or another state of emergency, the stated meeting shall be on the next successive Thursday at 7:30 p.m. after relief from the cause of the postponement.

Called meetings for trials, conferral of degrees, receiving of petitions, or ceremonial observances may be held upon call of the presiding officer, and at such times as the interests of the Lodge may require.

Revised By-Laws:

ARTICLE 1

Section 1. (Reg. 22)

The stated meetings of this Lodge shall be held on the first Thursday of each month, except July and August, at the discretion of the presiding officer, giving notice to the members no later than the preceding stated meeting if they are to be held, opening at 7:30 p.m.; unless the meeting falls on January 1st or July 4th, in such case, the meeting shall be held on the following Thursday at 7:30 p.m. Should the meeting be postponed due to weather or another state of emergency, the stated meeting shall be on the next successive Thursday at 7:30 p.m. after relief from the cause of the postponement.

Called meetings for trials, conferral of degrees, receiving of petitions, or ceremonial observances may be held upon the call of the presiding officer and at such times as the interests of the Lodge may require.

Building Fund - Rant

Hopefully, most of you are aware that the Lakeville Masonic Temple's utility bills, insurance, and property taxes are paid out of an account funded by Lakeville Lodge #353 and Lakeville Eastern Star Chapter #479 fundraisers. The primary source of income for this account in the past was the annual Chicken & Noodle Dinner and Spaghetti Supper, but we have not had those events in quite a few years. The building expenses have been paid by our surplus of funds from before Covid 19, the few fundraisers we have had during and since, donations from members from the Eastern Star and Lodge, and four very generous donations from members of the Eastern Star.

As stated above, we will start having our dinners again, but we must get the Brothers of Lakeville Lodge to volunteer to help these events be successful. That means we need you to be there to help serve, cook, and clean up at the event, to help with preparations before the event, and to sell tickets to get people to the events. While you might not be able to be there for the entire time, any time you can spare is helpful.

It costs over \$10,000 a year to keep the building open and the lights on. The Lodge's share is around \$5000. Currently, the Lodge has 83 Brothers, 15 of whom do not pay dues due to being either an Award of Gold or Lifetime Endowment Brother. That leaves 68 of whom pay Dues. To keep the General Fund at the current levels and pay our share of the Building Expenses, **if we do not have successful fundraisers**, we would need to raise our dues to almost \$175 per dues paying Brother, which would need to increase each year as the assessments from Grand Lodge increases each year. I strongly believe it is better and more sustainable to ask a Brother to volunteer their time or sell tickets to or for something than to ask for higher dues or donations. That said, I also don't want to do one fundraiser after another every year.

Please let us know if you have suggestions or would like to take the lead on a fundraising opportunity. We never know what will or will not work until we try.
